**A.) HPC Facebook: Webster School**

Caroline Edmonds passed out the National Registry forms to the Commission members. Caroline expressed that she needed pictures of the Webster school for the Facebook page. Joe Rhinehart will be able to supply these. Caroline also expressed a need for fun facts about the school to include in the Facebook post. The commission was able to share several fun facts, including that this is possibly the only school in the USA that made a marker for the students from that school that were lost or killed in WW II. The marker is still there. Also, the gym was indoors and functioned as both a cafeteria and an auditorium. Joe shared that the rocks were carried from up from the river to build the school. They also discussed the general history of the school, including that the school was built in the 1930's and that the first principal was Miss Charlotte Young. When the school was built, the county only paid for 3 months' worth of school, so the parents paid the teacher's salary, which was about \$45.00 per month.
